**Scope**

This policy applies to all prospective students applying for graduate/master programs

**Entry requirements**

Applicants for the AUM graduate programs need to submit the following:

- **Official AUM application:** to be submitted online (*please see webpage of Admissions*)
- **A baccalaureate degree** (comparable to EQF/MQF Level 6) with a minimum of 180/240 ECTS or equivalent with CGPA not less than 2.2. Scanned copies of qualifications and transcripts in the original language, as well as certified English translations, if necessary. If admitted to AUM, all original documents must be presented to the Admissions Office to be permitted to enroll.
- **Proof of English Proficiency**
  - The English language proficiency requirement may be waived if you are a native speaker of English and you have completed your secondary education in an English medium institution in a country where English is the official language.
  - AUM reserves the right to request English test results from any applicant.

**Conditional admission** is offered to all applicants who meet all requirements except English proficiency. Conditional admits must enrol as full-time students in the AUM English Language Program (ELP) program. A conditional admission student must achieve the required English language proficiency for full admission after completing a language preparation course.
